

Advent 2008 – Reflections on Year B

The gospel text for Year B, which begins with Advent, is Mark. The Good News that we find ushered by Jesus in Mark's gospel is that of transformative power. Mark has no birth narrative, no Christmas story. For Advent, then, the Lectionary gives us an apocalyptic text (Mark 13), then John the Baptist (Mark 1) and then shifts to John and Luke.

An insightful article on Mark's gospel by William Loader, *The Gospel of Mark* at www.staff.murdoch.edu.au, talks about the "transformative power" that is Mark's understanding of the good news to which Jesus points. If Advent is preparing for the coming of Jesus, the coming of Jesus' purpose/meaning/message, then our texts might encompass what we understand to be the purpose/meaning/message; for Loader this would be an image of the transformative power.

As an alternative to the Lectionary, in keeping with Mark's understanding of the good news that is born among us this holy season, I would offer the following four gospel texts for Advent.
